How to use this devotional

Each week there is Scripture, prayer, worship, and activities for your family. Use this devotional in the way it fits your family. The Children's Ministries Team has provided ideas and examples to get you started. If you discover a way your family loves to practice any of the sections, feel free to do that every week instead!

Books of the Bible

This year the whole church family is working to learn the books of the Bible! Each week has a few books to learn in order until you've memorized them all.

Prayer

We recommend beginning with prayer. Start by entering into the presence of God! There is a sample prayer to help guide you, but pray in the way that feels most natural for your family. You might begin by using the provided prayers, and as you become more comfortable, offer your own. If you have older children, consider inviting them to lead the prayer as they grow familiar with the routine. Encourage everyone to say "Amen" together — including the littlest ones just learning to speak!

Worship

Scan the QR code to access the worship music playlist.



Some weeks, a specific song or theme may be highlighted that connects to the week's focus. There are so many creative ways to engage in musical worship and make it part of your family's routine—play the playlist on your devices at home, listen at bathtime, or in the car on the way to school. Even better, have a dance party in the kitchen! The possibilities are endless!

Bible Reading + Questions

Read the Scripture provided for the week and answer the questions. Leave time for your child(ren) to ask their own questions. Use your family Bible or a children's Bible.

Activity + Games

Engage with the provided game or activity to help children learn the main idea of the Scripture in an interactive, hands-on way. Do this after the Bible-reading and discussion time, or save it for another day to reinforce the lesson and deepen your family's learning experience.

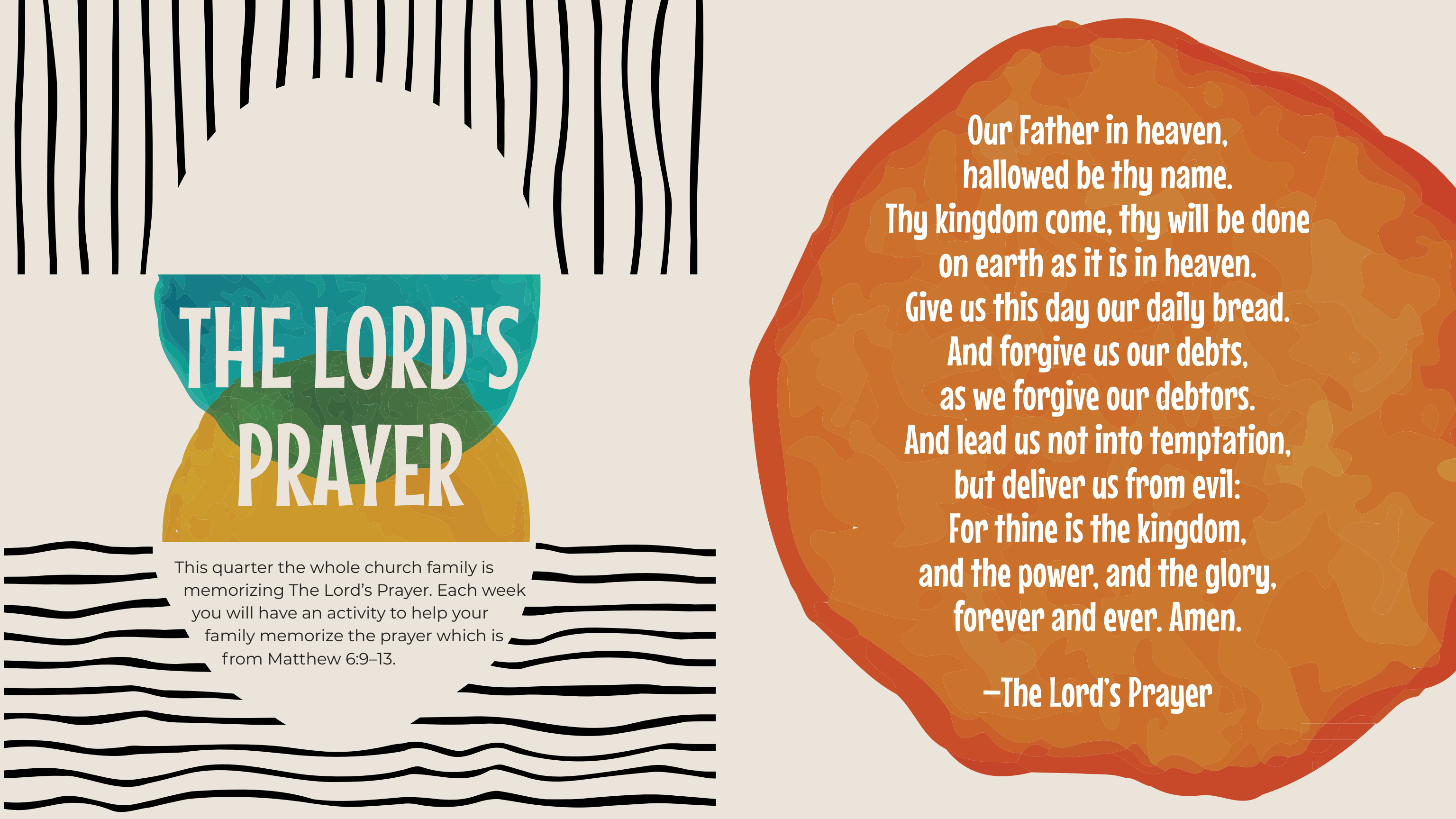
Memory Practice

Each week, there is a family-friendly way to practice the memory element together. There are many ways to do memory work, so feel free to use what works best for your children's ages and stages!

Blessing

End your time together with a blessing! This can be a blessing for the whole family or given individually to each person. We've provided a sample blessing to help you get started, but feel free to personalize it—consider incorporating Scripture or meaningful words of your own.

Encourage the children to hold their hands out in front of them—raised or with palms open—as if they're ready to receive a gift. Let them know they can simply listen and receive the blessing as you speak it over them.

What are some words or phrases from this song that your family would like to remember? Consider writing them down on an index card and placing it somewhere that everyone can see to be reminded of who God is.

BIBLE READING + QUESTIONS

Read Isaiah 9:2, 6–7, 11:1, and 53:5–6

- What kind of Messiah King were they waiting for?
- What event do you think is being predicted in Isaiah 53:5–6?
- What is sin, and why do people need to be saved or rescued from their sin through the death of Jesus?
- Bonus: What kind of darkness are we living in today and what does God promise for our future?

MEMORY PRACTICE

Read the prayer aloud while your family listens.
Talk about what it means.

ACTIVITY | GAME

Seek and Find in the Dark!

Write the names of our Promised Savior Jesus from Isaiah 9:6–7 on separate pieces of paper or index cards (Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace).

Have someone hide them in a dark room. Give everyone else flashlights to seek and find the names. Once they have all been found, read them aloud and cheer and celebrate who Jesus is!

To extend the game, write God's promises from the texts you read today so you have more note cards to find. Example: Jesus will be born from the family line of David, he will bring light to the darkness of our sin and world, etc.

BLESSING

Today, remember that God **always** does what he says he will do! May your heart be full of joy and thankfulness because God sent Jesus to rescue us and bring us into his family!

- What do these verses tell us about God?
- What is our role in our relationship with God according to verses 40–41?
- What should we do when we are sad (in the "depths of the pit")? How does God respond when we call out to him?

BLESSING

May you rejoice today because God's love never, ever ends. His kindness is brand new each day. Like the sunrise, it is fresh and ready for you every single morning! May you rest in the truth that God hears your cries when you are sad. He will always be with you! You are not alone!

ACTIVITY | GAME

The "New Morning" Hope Journal

Supplies: 3–5 sheets of paper folded in half or a small notebook for each person, crayons, markers or colored pencils.

1. Have each person draw a sunrise on their cover. Write: "God's Mercies are New Every Morning" (Lamentations 3:23) across the top.
2. Title the left side of the first page "Sad Song". Draw or write one thing that made you sad this week. This is "Lament."
3. Title the right side of the first page "New Mercy". Draw or write one good thing God gave you today (a snack, a hug, a sunny day). This is "Hope."
4. Draw a heart in the middle of the two pages to show that God is with you in both the sad and the happy parts of each day.

Extend the activity: Share these prompts to use the journals all week:

- God, today I feel...
- One way I saw your kindness today was...
- When I am scared, I remember that you are...
- Thank you for the gift of...
- A verse that helps me have hope when I feel sad is...

- How does knowing God has a good plan for you help when life feels messy or unfair?

all together.

ACTIVITY | GAME

Hope Garden

Since God told the people to "plant
gardens" while they waited, your
family will create a reminder to grow
where they are.

Supplies: paper cups or small pots for
each member of the family, or a large
container for the whole family,
quick-growing seeds (like grass or
beans), markers, and stickers.

- **Decorate:** Have the kids decorate
their "Hope Cup" with stickers or
write a Bible verse about hope on
the cup.
For example: Jeremiah 29:11.
- **The "Waiting" Truth:** Explain that
seeds take time to grow. Just like
the Israelites in Babylon, the seeds
will be "waiting" under the dirt, but
God will be working on them!
- **Plant:** Put a little soil and a seed
in the cup. Water it and observe
each day. How is the Holy Spirit
prompting you to grow in your
relationship with God and others
while you wait for an answer to
prayer or a hard situation?

- What would you say is the best news God has for you?

BLESSING

May God give you joy as the good
news God has for his people lifts
your heart and brings you peace.
May you hold Jesus close, loving
him so much, just as he loves you.

ACTIVITY | GAME

Dry Bones, Hear!

This game is sort of like musical chairs, except there are no chairs. That's because in this game you'll pretend to be like the lifeless bones that came alive in Ezekiel 37!

Invite everyone in your family to spread out and lie down on the floor. When the music isn't playing, they must lie completely still.

Designate a leader to give directions and play the music. When they say, "Dry bones, hear!" and start the music, then everyone comes to life. They must get up, walk around in a funny way, or dance, just so long as they keep moving while the music is playing.

When the music stops, everyone drops to the floor and lies perfectly still. The last person to stop moving is out.

Play continues, eliminating one player per round, until there is only one person left. That person wins!

- What characters showed faith in God and how did they demonstrate their faith?
- How did God show his faithfulness in this passage?
- What do we learn about God in this passage?

ACTIVITY | GAME

Lion's Den

(Younger Children)

Build a "lion's den" fort with your family. You can bring in stuffed animals to represent the lions. Get a flashlight and read the story from Daniel 6 inside the fort. Discuss how Daniel might have felt while he was in the den and the king's response when he found Daniel alive.

Extend the activity: What are "lion's den" or scary moments you have felt? How did God meet you there?

(Older Children)

After reading Daniel 1, do a blindfolded taste test with sugary snacks and raw fruits/vegetables. Try to guess the ingredients in the foods. Discuss which food tastes better and which ones would you want to choose first.

Questions: If friends are offering you something that you want but shouldn't have, is it hard or easy to tell them no? Why or why not? Why did Daniel choose not to indulge in all the things being offered to him, and how did God respond to that choice?

Write out The Lord's Prayer on a large piece of paper, decorate it, and hang it in a visible place.

*Let whoever is wise understand these things,
and whoever is insightful recognize them.
For the ways of the Lord are right,
and the righteous walk in them,
but the rebellious stumble in them.*

What do you think happens when we don't follow God's direction?

BLESSING

May you wake each day to a mercy that is as fresh and certain, knowing God's love for you. Even when you wander, may his great faithfulness be the steady hand that leads you home and the love that never lets you go.

- What does this story tell us about God's grace for us when we sin?

Create a song or beat to sing the verse. Clap, stomp, use instruments, or just sing!

MEMORY PRACTICE

ACTIVITY | GAME

Fill two clear jars with water. Tell your family the water represents our minds and how we see the world.

In the first jar, add food coloring, close the lid, and shake it up. Leave the second jar clear.

Have everyone look at the room through the jar of dyed water. Say: "This is like Jonah's anger. He was so mad that he couldn't see clearly. His vision was clouded by his own feelings, so he couldn't see how much God loved the people of Nineveh. He was too frustrated to see the truth!"

Next, look through the jar of clear water. Say: "This jar represents God's vision. God isn't clouded by anger; he sees every situation perfectly. Even though the people of Nineveh had sinned against him, God saw all 120,000 people and chose to show them grace and mercy."

May the Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace.

ACTIVITY | GAME

You will need: a piece of paper and a fan (or just your own lung power!).

- Hold the paper up a few feet away from your kids. Ask them: "Look closely... is there anything in the air between me and this paper?"
- Turn on the fan or blow a giant breath at the paper so it flutters and moves.
- Ask these questions:
 - Did you see the wind hit the paper?
 - What color was that wind? Was it polka-dotted? Was it neon green?
 - What shape was it? Was it shaped like a triangle or a dinosaur?
 - The Big Question: If we can't see it, see its color, or see its shape... how do we know it's actually there?

God is a lot like the wind! We can't look at him with our eyes, but we can see his "fingerprints" everywhere when he moves things and changes our hearts.

Now that you know how to look for "invisible" things, take the mission out into the real world! Head outside for a 15-minute walk. Your goal is to find "God's fingerprints." Look for things he made (like a cool bug or a bright sunset) or things that remind you of him, like the way a tall tree feels strong. During a meal this week, ask everyone where they saw God working that day.

Read John 2:1-11

- What was the miracle Jesus performed in these verses and what does this miracle teach us about Jesus' love and care for us?
- What do these verses show us about Mary's trust in who Jesus is?
- How do these verses help us trust Jesus everyday?

ACTIVITY | GAME

Beat the Clock

Supplies: a large pot or laundry basket (adjust the size based on the size of your family), and something to use for a timer.

Have your family gather a lot of blue items from around the house. These could include towels, socks, Legos, or other blue blocks, toys, etc. Spread them around. Set a timer for 60 seconds. Explain that the servants in our Bible reading today had to listen to Jesus and work hard to fill the jars of water to the brim. The goal is for the family to work together to gather every single blue item in the room and fill the "stone jar" before the timer goes off.

Hint: You can make it more difficult for older kids or parents by giving them rules. (e.g. dad can only use his left hand, or everyone has to hop on one foot, or everyone has to pick up the item with their feet, etc.)

The Takeaway: The servants had to obey Jesus completely to see the miracle happen. How are we obeying Jesus and what everyday miracles have we seen in our lives?

BIBLE READING + QUESTIONS

Read Matthew 11:27–30

- What is a yoke? (This is a farming tool used to train a new ox by pairing them with an experienced, well-trained older ox. Look up some pictures, especially if this is a new idea for your children.)
- Jesus promised that his yoke is easy. How does his love and presence make our daily lives feel lighter than if we were trying to do everything on our own?
- What is something hard (heavy) right now that you can give to Jesus?

ACTIVITY | GAME

Blindfold one person (the young ox) and walk through the house or outside. Stop and take time to notice if it was difficult, if you bumped into things, or felt scared.

Now pair them with a family member. Have them stand side by side, and link arms together. The person who is not blindfolded (the experienced ox) helps guide and show the way for the person who is blindfolded. If you want to add more fun, set up an obstacle course to try this experiment!

As you are playing the game take time to answer these questions:

- What was it like walking blindfolded without help?
- How did it change when you were yoked (linked arms) with someone who could see clearly without a blindfold?
- What does this experience teach you about being yoked with Jesus?

BIBLE READING + QUESTIONS

Read Luke 6:43–45

- Think about your favorite fruit. There are so many things that make it yummy! Now, think about your favorite people. What are some "good" things about them that make you love them so much?
- Imagine biting into a piece of fruit that looked yummy but tasted sour or rotten. Yuck! Sometimes our words or actions can be "sour" like that, too. Can you think of a time when you said or did something that wasn't kind?
- The overflow of following Jesus is a loving heart with good "fruit" that others can see in your life. How can you ask God to help you be more like Jesus?

PRAYER

Jesus, help me to be with you, to become more like you, and to live like you. Amen.

BLESSING

May we remember it takes time to grow good fruit and that we are never without you, our Perfect Gardener.
